April is a quiet month for special events as downtown gears up for a bustling summer. However, you can always count on First Friday which this month is on April 5th from 5:00 -8:00. It's a great way to explore galleries, shopping, and eateries through the evening. The main streets of Bay, West, and Scott close for visitors to take their time and explore. Enjoy the entertainment and live demonstrations and meet the merchants.

In addition, there are several historical sites such as the Verdier House Museum. Docentguided tours are available Monday - Saturday from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. where you can learn about this 1804 estate, which is the only historic planter's house in the city open to the public.

Finally, there are many tours you can choose from to learn about Beaufort: everything from its history to its architecture to its movie locations. You can take walking tours, carriage tours, and even see the sights from a golf cart.

Featured Local Business of the Month:



The Lady's Island Bridge (Woods Memorial) is going to be on a temporary deviation from its normal schedule through September 29th.

The bridge shall not open from 6:00 a.m. to 9:29 a.m. and 3:31 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday (except Federal holidays). Between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday (except Federal holidays), the bridge will only open once per hour on the half hour. All other times, including weekends and Federal holidays, the bridge shall open on signal.



What does this mean for you? If you're heading to our marina during the week, make sure you get to the bridge before 6:00 a.m. or you'll need to wait until 9:30 a.m. for the bridge to open. If you're coming in the afternoon, arrive before 3:30 p.m. or you'll need to wait until 7:00 p.m.

For those of you who have traveled on the ICW between Charleston and Beaufort, it's the same schedule during the week as the Wappoo Bridge south of Charleston. But it's better than the Wappoo Bridge in that the Lady's Island Bridge opens on request during the weekends!
